ROAD HEAVY START

The club completed a five-game road trip on Tuesday with a 2-1 shootout win at Seattle. It's part of a road-heavy start for the Blue Jackets with 10 of the first 16 games of the season played away from Nationwide Arena. The club is currently in a stretch of 9-of-12 games played on the road from Nov. 2-24 with its lone home games a three-game homestand from Nov. 13-17. Following the team's game at Washington on Nov. 24, the Jackets will have played a franchise-high 14 of their first 23 games of a campaign on the road, surpassing the 13 road contests to begin the 2009-10 and 2015-16 seasons.

CBJ play a franchise-high 18 road games through the first 30 games of a campaign. It's tied for the second-most in the NHL this season (Calgary), trailing only Utah's 19 road contests. The team is 5-4-1 away from NWA and ranks in the top-10 in the league on the road in shots-per-game (2nd – 33.3 shots/GP) and power play percentage (10th – 21.7 pct).

NOVEMBER OUTLOOK

Columbus plays nine of its 15 games in the month of November away from Nationwide Arena with two multi-game trips from Nov. 2-11 (NY Islanders, Calgary, Vancouver, Edmonton, Seattle) and Nov. 18-24 (Winnipeg, Toronto, Detroit, Washington). The Jackets host a three-game homestand from Nov. 13-17 against Edmonton, NY Rangers and Montreal. The team plays three back-to-backs in the month on Nov. 1-2 vs. St. Louis and at NY Islanders (1-1-0), Nov. 10-11 at Edmonton and Seattle with the third on Nov. 17-18 vs. Montreal and at Winnipeg. The club wraps up the month with two games at Nationwide Arena on Nov. 26 vs. Toronto and Nov. 28 vs. Pittsburgh. The Jackets went 5-6-2 (12 pts) in 13 November games during the 2024-25 season.

SHORT SERIES WITH EDMONTON

The Blue Jackets play the Oilers twice in the span of four days from Nov. 10-13 to complete the 2025-26 season series. The clubs split the 2024-25 season series (1-1-0) with both teams winning their respective home contests. The Jackets have earned points in six of the past eight games overall against Edmonton (5-2-1) after picking up a point on Monday. It's one of two short series this season (10-days or less) as the club will play its home-and-home series against Chicago over six days from Jan. 30-Feb. 4. Last season, the club had four of its two game season series played over 10-days or less as it faced Calgary (5 days), Minnesota (10 days), St. Louis (8 days) and Utah (7 days).

FANTASTIC FANTILLI

C **Adam Fantilli**, has notched points in three-straight contests with two multi-point performances (2-3-5) after scoring the game-tying goal on Tuesday in Seattle. He has picked up 2-4-6 in his last five contests. He became the fourth-fastest Blue Jackets player to 90 NHL points (146 GP) on Monday in Edmonton with his 1-1-2 effort, trailing only Pierre-Luc Dubois (128 GP), Nikolay Zherdev (131 GP) and Rick Nash (141 GP). The Nobleton, Ontario native sits eight points shy of 100 for his NHL/CBJ career (47-45-92, 147 GP).

CHARLIE SETS THEM UP

C Charlie Coyle, who scored his 21st career shootout goal – and 11th game-deciding goal – on Tuesday at Seattle, has posted five points in his past seven games (1-4-5). He notched his first career four-assist and +5 plus/minus rating game on Oct. 29 vs. Toronto (0-4-4) to become the third player in franchise history with four primary assists in a single game (Panarin 5 on Dec. 8, 2017; Hartnell 4 on Oct. 23, 2014). He is tied for second on the team in assists (7, Voronkov). He notched his 300th career assist on the first of his four helpers on Oct. 29. At 33 years, 241 days old, he became the oldest Blue Jackets player with at least three assists in a single game since Vinny Prospal (38 years, 30 days) on Mar. 19, 2013. He has skated in 345 consecutive games since Oct. 16, 2021, tied for the fourth-longest active streak in the NHL. Acquired in a trade with Colorado on June 27, he has collected 191-303-494 in 966 career games played with the Blue Jackets, Avalanche, Boston Bruins and Minnesota Wild in 14 NHL seasons.

MARCHY MADNESS

RW **Kirill Marchenko** extended his career-high points streak to nine-straight games (3-8-11) after logging an assist on Tuesday in Seattle. The streak included a career-best five-game assists streak from Oct. 25-Nov. 2. It's tied for the sixth-longest points streak in Blue Jackets history (8th time) and is the longest since Patrik Laine's 11-game points streak (3rd-longest) from Jan. 27-Feb. 24, 2022. He has points in 14 of the team's 16 games in 2025-26 (8-10-18) and leads the team in goals, assists, points, and plus/minus rating (tied, +8). He ranks in the top-10 in the NHL on the road in shots on goal (4th), points (6th-T), goals (7th-T) and points-per-game (10th-T, min. 5 GP) with 6-7-13, 1.30 P/GP, 38 shots and a +4 rating in nine contests.

Marchenko became the third-fastest player in Blue Jackets history to record 150 NHL points (225 GP), with Dubois (217 GP) and Nash (208 GP) leading the list after collecting a point on Tuesday.

ZACH ATTACK

D **Zach Werenski** ranks second in the NHL this season in time on ice per game at 26:45, while also leading league blueliners in shots on goal (55) and ranking third-T in both goals (4) and multi-point performances (4). He tied his personal best and the club record for a defenseman with goals and multi-points in three consecutive games from Oct. 28-Nov.1 (3-3-6). His 1-1-2 effort on Nov. 1 vs. St. Louis was the 83rd of his career, moving past Boone Jenner (82) for the second-most in franchise history. The blueliner sits six points shy from 400 for his NHL/CBJ career and would become the third player in franchise history to reach the milestone. He scored his 26th career power play goal on Oct. 28 at Buffalo to pass Nikolay Zherdev for the eighth-most in club history. The blueliner entered the 2025-26 campaign as the franchise's all-time leader in goals, assists and points by a defenseman.

The 2024-25 Norris Trophy runner-up, he set the single-season franchise record among defensemen in goals, assists and points for the second consecutive season while also tying the club record for assists in a season (Panarin, 59 in 2018-19) with 23-59-82 in 81 GP. The Grosse Pointe, Michigan native led the NHL in ice time (26:45) and ranked third in shots on goal (298), while leading league blueliners in shots and even-strength goals (17), ranking second in goals, points, power play goals (tied, 5), and even strength points (54) as well as fourth in assists during the 2024-25 campaign.

QUICK HITTERS

TEAM QUICK HITS

- Columbus earned its 5th comeback win of the season at Seattle on Tuesday and 4 of the past 5 CBJ victories have been in comefrom-behind fashion.
- CBJ's game on Monday at EDM began a stretch of 6 games in 9 days, including 2 back-to-backs, from Nov. 10-18
- CBJ are 5-2-1 in back-to-backs this season and have gone 2-1-1 in the 1st game and 3-1-0 in the 2nd game
- CBJ have played in 1-goal games in 7 of the past 9 contests (4-2-1 in those contests), including 4-of-5 on the recently completed road trip
- CBJ have killed off 15-of-16 opponent power plays over the last 8 contests and lead the NHL in penalty kill percentage (93.8 pct.) since Oct. 26
- CBJ rank 3rd in the NHL in shots on goal per game at 32.1 and have outshot opponents in 10-of-16 contests in 2025-26
- CBJ (12-19-31) lead the league in goals and goal percentage by defensemen at 12 and 25.0 pct. respectively; Club tied the franchise mark and finished 2nd among teams in goals in 2024-25 with 51
- CBJ are 2nd in the league in assist percentage by forwards (76.5 pct.)
- CBJ rank 9th in the NHL in team save percentage (.899) and 10th in total saves made (454)
- CBJ have 12 first-round picks on the opening-day roster tied for 2nd-most and trailing only MIN (13)
- CBJ's opening day roster is 27.6, tied for 6th-youngest (SJS)
- CBJ, who finished 40-33-9 (89 pts) in 2024-25, were the league's most improved team with +13 wins and +23 points compared to the 2023-24 season and had the 2nd-largest goals-for/goals-against differential improvement (+64)
- CBJ's 267 goals (3.26 GF/GP) scored in 2024-25 were the most in a single-season in franchise history and 7th-T most in the NHL
